<b>Application procedure</b>	<p><b>Step 1:</b> official nomination by the home university to <a href="mailto:incoming@sciencespo-saintgermain.fr">incoming@sciencespo-saintgermain.fr</a></p> <p><b>Step 2:</b> nominated students are e-mailed an application form to complete and the list of supporting documents to submit :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- last university grades</li> <li>- evidence of French or English level</li> <li>- passport copy</li> <li>- ID photo (for the student card)</li> </ul> <p><b>Step3:</b> upon reception of the complete application, the International Office emails the student his/her Acceptance letter and information to prepare the exchange.</p>

<b>Language Prerequisites</b>	<p>Non-French and non-English native-speakers will need to provide a language certificate showing a B2 or higher level in French or in English as defined in the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference) - Accepted certificate in French : DELF, DALF, TCF, CEFP / in English : TOEFL iBT 72 minimum, IELTS 5.5 minimum</p>
<b>Language support</b>	<p>French as a foreign language is offered, all year long, free of charge for 3 different levels: beginner, intermediate, advanced (up to 50 hours per semester, twice a week).</p>

<b>Estimated cost of living</b>	800 € - 1000 € per month
<b>Accommodation</b>	<p>The international relations team provides support and guidance to students finding a suitable place in the area, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- studios or shared rooms in private student halls</li> <li>- accommodation in families with an international background</li> </ul>
<b>Airport pick-up service</b>	Free of charge upon registration, on specified week days before the orientation
<b>Health insurance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- EU/EEA nationals should apply and obtain the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for reduced cost or free medical treatment</li> <li>- All non-European students should enroll in the French national health insurance (free of charge): <a href="https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr">https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr</a></li> </ul>
<b>Student life</b>	<p>All exchange students are provided the same access to campus facilities as local students (library, social and cultural events, sports...).</p> <p>Incoming students are placed in contact with student associations and assigned a "Buddy" who supports them during their arrival and stay.</p>
