ELIGIBILITY

Students must have completed at least one year of study at their home university and meet the College requirements for English proficiency. You must be majoring in a field of study within the College of Arts + Sciences (full list of departments can be found [online](#)).

College Language Requirements

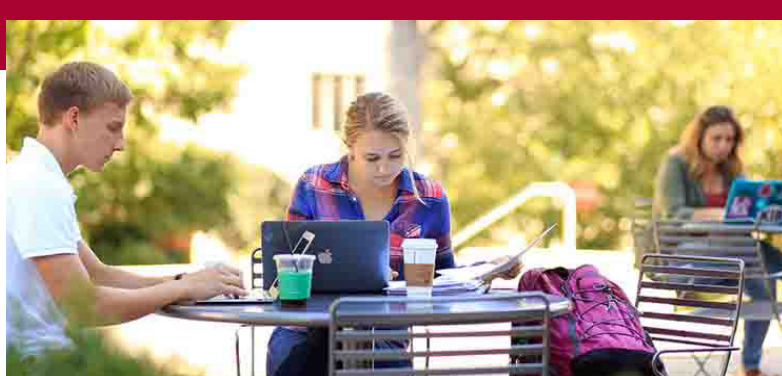
TOEFL	Total 95; min scores of 22 in Speaking and Listening sections
IELTS	Overall 7; min scores of 6.5 in Speaking and Listening sections



ACADEMICS

You will enroll in at least 12 credit hours per semester at IU and receive transfer credit in accordance with the policies of your home institution. An official IU transcript will be sent to your home institution at the conclusion of your exchange.

The American academic structure promotes continuous assessment, with periodic tests and quizzes throughout the semester. There is usually homework or reading to be completed each week. Class size can range from large discussion courses to small courses of a few students, depending on the level and content of the course.



FINANCES

Tuition and fees are paid to your home institution, not to Indiana University. Exchange students are responsible for their housing, meals, health insurance (or ability to submit proof of insurance), books, and supplies. Additional fees may include international student services, health center visits, and parking permits.

VISAS

Indiana University will provide support for exchange students in obtaining the necessary J-1 student visa. After you have submitted your application to IU, the Office of International Services (OIS) will contact you for the documentation required to create a DS-2019 immigration form. This form will be used to apply for a visa at the U.S. embassy or consulate in your home country. More information can be found on the OIS website: ois.iu.edu.

IMPORTANT DATES

Exchange students are required to attend an orientation session before classes begin and are expected to remain until the end of final exams. Please wait until you have received official dates from IU before you book your travel.

APPLYING

Exchange students must be nominated by their home university. Please consult your home institution for application deadlines. Once the College of Arts + Sciences has accepted the nominations, you will apply to Indiana University for admission. Deadlines to apply to IU are in September for Spring admission and March for Fall admission.

HOUSING

On-campus housing is available for exchange students. Residence halls include double rooms and apartment-style housing, with shared bathrooms and air conditioning.
