ACCOMMODATION

Undergraduate visiting students should be able to have accommodation on campus. However, if we're at capacity then we'll support students in finding accommodation in the city, which is close to campus. Accommodation applications are made online from June (for October starters) and November (for January starters). Emails are sent to students at the start of application period with further information about how to apply. Students will be notified of the outcome of their application in August (for October starters) and December (for January starters).

It is not always possible to accommodate Postgraduate students on campus, but they are encouraged to apply so that we can offer support in finding appropriate accommodation. It is likely that they will be able to find accommodation with one of our approved partners.

Students wishing to make their own accommodation arrangements may visit [Lancaster University Homes](#). We recommend that students live in Lancaster, as a long commute may negatively affect their experience. Students who do not live in University accommodation will still be a member of a College.

Grade information and requirements

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Grade requirements	Students will need a minimum GPA of 3.0 or a B average (or equivalent, i.e., Credit for Australian partners). Please contact us if you have exceptions you want to discuss.
Language requirements	All teaching is in English. If the student is not a national of a country that is deemed to be a majority-English speaking country by the UK Visas and Immigration Service, then evidence of English language proficiency will be required. The type of evidence required depends on the student's nationality and the type of visa needed. More information and alternative tests requirements can be found at: lancaster.ac.uk/studyabroad
Visas for non-UK passport holders	Students may need a visa or electronic travel authorisation (ETA) to enter the UK, depending on their nationality and how long they intend to remain in the UK for their studies. They can check gov.uk/check-uk-visa to see what type of documents they need. Guidance will be sent to students as part of our admissions process. Nomination and application guidelines

As part of the application, the student will need to complete a provisional list of modules they would like to take (Study Plan). This should also include at least two reserve choices in case any of their first-choice modules are no longer running or are full. An up-to-date list of modules can be found at: lancaster.ac.uk/studyabroad-modules.

If the student is postgraduate, please contact us for further advice on the modules available. Postgraduate modules are only available to partners with whom we have an agreement at Masters level.

As part of the application the student must upload a copy of their most recent transcript. We will also need to receive a copy of their current passport before we can issue any visa documentation. This can be sent separately if the student does not have one yet. Once the application had been submitted students will be able to download a PDF of the application for their records.
