Accommodation

University-administered Accommodation	<p>The College of Sciences is committed to aiding incoming exchange students in their application for university accommodation; however, it's important to note that accommodation availability cannot be guaranteed.</p> <p>Please refer to this page on the International Affairs Office's website for information on the types of rooms and their costs in the school dormitories.</p>
Private Accommodation	<p>The College of Science is unable to provide assistance for exchange students searching for off-campus housing. However, the International Affairs Office's website offers valuable information and external housing search platforms for students to explore independently.</p>

Visa Requirement / Employment

Visa	<p>Notably, there is no specific 'Student Visa' for international students studying in Taiwan. For those with an exchange period of less than 180 days, it is recommended to apply for an extendable Visitor Visa, while students with an exchange period exceeding 180 days should apply for a Resident Visa.</p> <p><u>Visa</u></p> <p>Prior to your arrival in Taiwan, you are required to apply for either a Resident or Visitor Visa through the Taiwan Diplomatic Mission in your country of residence. This process typically requires presenting the official admission letter issued by National Taiwan University as part of your visa application. It is important to note that failing to obtain a valid visa issued by a Taiwan Diplomatic Mission may result in the</p>

cancellation of your status as an exchange student.

ARC (Alien Resident Certificate)

Students who arrive in Taiwan with a Resident Visa or obtain one after arriving must apply for an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) and a Re-entry Permit at the local service centers of the National Immigration Agency. Students entering with a Resident Visa must apply within 30 days of the day after their arrival, while those obtaining a Resident Visa after arrival must apply within 30 days of the visa issuance date.

PRC (Chinese) Passport Holders

Students with a Mainland China Passport must obtain an Exit and Entry Permit for entry into Taiwan. The Program Coordinator of the College of Science will assist you in obtaining the permit.

Health & Medical Insurance

Compulsory medical insurance

Health Insurance

Exchange students are required to obtain personal insurance from their country of residence before traveling to Taiwan. Please provide proof of insurance in **Chinese or English** valid for your entire exchange period for the following:

- Accident insurance coverage must be a minimum of TWD 1,000,000 (approx. USD 34,000)
- Medical insurance coverage must be a minimum of TWD 1,000,000 (approximately USD 34,000)

Alternatively, individuals with an Alien Resident Certificate who meet the six-month residency requirement have the option to enroll in the National Health Insurance program. The monthly premium for this option is around TWD 749. However, it's important to note that National Health Insurance is presently unavailable for individuals from Mainland China.

NTU Health Exam Policy

In compliance with Taiwanese regulations, international students planning to stay in Taiwan for over 3 months are required to undergo a Medical Examination before enrolling. Please download the [NTU Health Exam Form and Form C](#) and have all sections completed by a qualified doctor in your home country. Submit the original hard copies to NTU on the day of registration. NTU Health Exam Form and Form C must be completed within 3 months prior to the registration date.

Health Certificate for Residence Application

If you are a one-year exchange student applying for a Resident Visa, you must complete a separate health exam that differs from the NTU Health Exam. To save time, it is recommended that you bring both [NTU Health Exam form and Form C](#) and [Health Certificate for Residence Application](#) to the hospital and complete them at once.
