Research Participation	Students are required to navigate and contact their POSTECH advising professor-to-be directly and receive official approval prior to the application process.
Maximum Period of Exchange	1 academic year (2 semesters)
Compulsory Medical Insurance	Students are required to purchase a separate insurance plan that covers most illnesses and injuries and is valid for at least 1 month from the student's arrival in Korea.  Additionally, as of March 2021, all international students in Korea will be automatically registered to the National Health Insurance Service (NHIS), effective from the date of their alien registration (most likely done within during the orientation week). All will be able to receive equal medical benefits as Korean nationals, receiving automatic discounts for doctors' appointments and prescription drugs. Exchange students will receive monthly invoices by post, and the cost will be approx. 70,000 KRW/month.
