### **III. Course Description:**

- The Way To Success course has a holistic design by international education and global leadership experts. This course is offered with the collaborated effort among School of Science, School of Engineering, School of Business & Management and CEO Global Education Foundation.
- Established in Hong Kong in 2005 as an educational non-profit organization, CEO Global focuses on effective servant leadership and transformational character development with an emphasis on the foundations of servant-hood, leadership, character and integrity. CEO Global seeks to instill university students with the right values so that they may bring positive impact in their spheres of influence and chosen professions.
- A multi-faceted teaching approach including professors and guest speaker lectures, experiential activities, simulation exercises, self-assessment, team-building games, videos and music, discussions, and competitions, are used to cover the issues of values and attitude, leadership rules, relationships and skills, as well as career planning and development.
- The course has a special focus on interactive exchanges, both teacher-mentor-student and peer interactions.

- Small groups are formed by students from different background for them to learn from each other, practice teamwork, and build long-term friendship through a wide range of group activities, sharing and projects.
- Service project is an important element of this course. This is an opportunity for students to put to practice the concepts learnt during lecture (such as teamwork, others centric perspective, leadership by service) to develop and enhance their sense of social responsibility. Students are responsible to take the initiative to identify opportunities and serve an authentic need in the community in which they live.
- Students' perspectives are broadened by guest speakers and mentors from different backgrounds including university professors, training experts, executives from multi-national corporations and non-profit organizations.
- The course is taught by university professors, international education experts, senior managers of well-known enterprises, as well as experienced corporate training experts.

#### IV. Intended Learning Objectives

- To become servant leaders of integrity with positive attitudes, good character, sound values and a heart for serving the needs of others.
- To improve personal qualities and leadership skills among participants through promoting team spirit, communication and life skills, better understanding of oneself, developing career and life planning, and broadening social and global perspectives.
- To be transformed in life purpose, values, principles, attitude and mind set; enabling students to be more competent in various aspects of social skills.

#### V. Assessment Scheme

*\*Note: Students **must** participate in all 4 assessment items in addition to a minimum 70% attendance rate for passing the course.*

- This learning experience is a two-credit course, graded Pass (P) or Fail (F). To achieve the Pass grade, each student must complete all tasks on time listed in the "Assessment Scheme" as "Compulsory" in addition to achieving a 70% attendance rate for passing the course
- Each student is required to submit a self-reflective paper to the Partner organization (copies will also be kept by HKUST) at the end of the course
- At the conclusion of the course, each group will need to conduct a final presentation to provide a detailed oral report on the entire project in

addition to the self-reflective paper (min. 800 words) submitted for the “Final Reflection” component

- Details of the final presentation will be provided by the Partner Organization
- Course evaluation will be conducted by the Partner organization and/or HKUST at the end of the course
