Singapore in general: Mask wearing is optional, but still required in healthcare facilities and residential care settings.





ABOUT SUTD

INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE **RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMME (iUROP)**

iUROP provides exchange students the opportunity to work together with SUTD faculty and students on cutting edge and innovative research projects.

Exchange students will be able to participate in the different phases of research activity which include developing research plans, writing proposals, conducting research, analyzing data and presenting research results in oral and written form. Besides immersing in SUTD's rich research culture, exchange students also get the chance to gain multicultural and interdisciplinary design perspectives.

Each exchange student is allowed to take one iUROP project per term. The exact number of hours depends on the project duration, project nature, students' progress and arrangement with project supervisor, as well as students' own time management.

HOW DOES IT WORK



FACULTY-LED IUROP

Exchange students take 2 to 4 academic subjects without taking any iUROP research project.

Minimum 24 credits and maximum 48 credits.

 Exchange students from Cardiff University, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, University of Ottawa and Vietnam National University, Hanoi -University of Engineering and Technology (VNU-UET) will only be able to choose this exchange option.



Exchange students take on a full-time iUROP research project under the supervision of SUTD faculty, without taking any academic subjects.

- iUROP is only available to undergraduate exchange students. Post-graduate students may consider Postgraduate Research Internship instead.
- This option is not open to exchange students from Texas A&M University students.
- 8-weeks Summer iUROP Meta is open to exchange students from University of California (UCEAP) only.

INBOUND EXCHANGE

ELIGIBILITY

- Nominated by SUTD partner universities to enjoy tuition fee waivers for exchange at SUTD.
- Ensure you are capable of going through an academic or research term with subjects or projects delivered in English.
- You should have a minimum cumulative GPA equivalent to a **3.0 on a 5.0 point scale.**

SUBJECTS OFFERED

- Exchange students can take subjects across different pillars but you are required to choose a host pillar (EPD, ESD, ISTD, ASD or HASS) during exchange application.
- DAI, EPD, ESD, ISTD and HASS subjects are available to all exchange students.
- ASD subjects are only available to exchange students from Zhejiang University, Aalto University, Chulalongkorn University, Feng Chia University, IE University, University of Seoul, Czech Technical University in Prague and University of Technology Sydney.
- Subjects in Term 1, 2 and 3 are not available to exchange students.
- All subjects are delivered in English.
- As allocation of subjects is subjected to availability and fulfillment of pre-requisites, you may not be given your preferred choice. Hence you are required to select up to 10 subjects in order of preference during exchange application.




IUROP PROJECTS OFFERED

- The list of iUROP projects differ from year to year, and will be ready 1 month before application.
- iUROP is not available to exchange students from Texas A&M University (iUROP Max only), Cardiff University, The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, University of Ottawa and Vietnam National University, Hanoi -University of Engineering and Technology (VNU-UET). 8-weeks Summer iUROP Meta is only available to exchange students from University of California (UCEAP).
- As allocation of projects is subjected to review, you may not be given your preferred choice. Hence you are required to select up to 5 subjects in order of preference during exchange application.

SUTD STUDENT INSURANCE

During your stay in SUTD (from Matriculation Day to end of Term), you will be covered by the SUTD Student Insurance Scheme (policy under NTUC Income).

We highly recommend students to purchase travel insurance with additional cover for COVID-19 to augment the coverage of the SUTD insurance. You would need to make your own arrangement for travel insurance coverage should you intend to extend your stay in Singapore beyond the end of Term.





SUTD will inform you on the procedures via email when the portal is open for application.






OFF-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

- Barrier-free access to and within buildings

CREDIT SYSTEM

1 SUTD Subject Credit (SCs) is equivalent to 1 hour of workload per week. The subject workload in terms of hours and SCs is represented by a series of 3 numbers. All of the 3 numbers add together to represent the total SCs for the subject.

For example: 3-5-4 (Total SCs is 12)

"3" (first number) represents actual contact hours for lectures or cohortbased learning per week

"5" (second number) represents hours for laboratory, design or fieldwork per week

"4" (third number) refers to hours a student is expected to spend on preparation per week

Please check with your home university on the credit transfer matters.

PROCEDURES

STEP 1

Create an Application Account

 $\mathsf{Visit}\ \textbf{admission.sutd.edu.sg}\ \mathsf{and}\ \mathsf{create}\ \mathsf{an}\ \mathsf{application}\ \mathsf{account.}$

Enter your own User ID, Full Name (as per your passport) and your Email Address. You will receive an email with User ID and Password at the email address you have entered upon successful account registration.

You will be required to change your password upon the first login.



Start Application

- 1. Select Application Type (Inbound) and Period of Study
- Select the correct Application Programme: Academic and Research (for students taking courses) Research Exchange (for students taking iUROP only)

Please read the instructions carefully at each stage of the application. Ensure that all supporting documents are submitted to avoid delay in processing of your application. Remember to click "Save" after you have completed each section.



Submit iUROP Project Selection (for students taking iUROP)

For students that are applying for iUROP (part-time or full-time), please ensure you have submitted your project selection via MS Form which will be shared with you after you have been nominated.

Exchange students can undertake a maximum of 1 iUROP project under the supervison of SUTD Faculty.



Please click "Print or get PDF of answers" after you have submitted the MS Form.



APPLYING FOR STUDENT PASS

All international students must hold a valid Student Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA) for their studies at SUTD. Generally, international students studying in SUTD are granted Student Pass for the full duration of the exchange period.

STEP 1

Application Through SOLAR System

Application for Student Pass is to be made through the ICA Student Pass On-Line Application & Registration (SOLAR) system.

SUTD will inform you via email when the SOLAR system is open for application. You are required to login to SOLAR to complete the application, submit eForm16 and make payment of SGD30.00 for the non-refundable processing fee for Student Pass application.

STEP 2

Issuance of In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter

After submitting your application, print out the electronic form eForm16 and bring it to Singapore, together with the In Principal Approval (IPA) Letter which will be emailed to you when your application is approved.

For students who require a visa to enter Singapore, a visa will be incorporated in the IPA letter. Students need not apply for a separate visa and may enter Singapore by producing the IPA letter at the customs.



Making Appointment with ICA

After receiving your IPA letter, login to SOLAR system to make payment of SGD60.00 for issuance fee and SGD30.00 for multiple-journey visa (where applicable). Also, make an appointment with ICA for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Digital Student Pass.

STEP 4

Issuance of Digital Student Pass

Upon arrival in Singapore, report to ICA on your appointment day for completion of formalities for the issuance of your Digital Student Pass. More information will be provided in the SUTD Handbook emailed to you upon exchange offer.

STEP 5

Cancellation of Digital Student Pass

SUTD will assist in the cancellation towards the end of your exchange. You will receive a "Notice of Cancellation of Student Pass" letter to be presented to the Immigration Officer when you leave Singapore. Once the Digital Student Pass has been cancelled, it will no longer be valid.

For visa-required nationals who are planning for any overseas trip out of Singapore after the Student Pass is cancelled, you will need to apply for the relevant pass/visa if you wish to re-enter Singapore.



(ANNEX) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How can I be nominated for exchange at SUTD?

You must be enrolled as a full-time student at one of our partner universities.

You can then apply through your home university exchange programme and your home university will nominate you.

to find out if your home university is one of SUTD partner universities.

What if my home university is not one of SUTD partner universities?

SUTD only provides student exchange opportunities to students from partner universities whom we have formalized collaborations through official agreements.

Should you be interested to pursue a term of study with SUTD, you may consider the option of enrolling with us as a nongraduating fee-paying student.

How many terms can I spend my exchange at SUTD?

You can spend up to a maximum of 3 terms at SUTD, subject to availability. Reach out to your home university for further advice.

What happens after I submit my application?

We will contact you if there are any missing documents or for further clarifications.

You will be notified via email on the outcome of your application.

Can non-engineering students come to SUTD on exchange?

Yes, SUTD offers nonengineering subjects as well, mainly from the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences (HASS) cluster. As places in each HASS subject are very limited, we advise students to be flexible with their study plan.

In general, students can apply for cross-pillar subjects as long as they fulfill the pre-requisites, subject to availability and timetable scheduling.

Can I change my subjects after the start of the exchange?

Yes, there is an Add Drop period in the first week of exchange, where you can add or drop subjects. Adding of subjects is subjected to fulfillment of pre-requisites, availability and timetable scheduling. You will be briefed on the procedures during Orientation.

How can I get my Learning Agreement endorsed?

Please email global@sutd. edu.sg and request for your Learning Agreement to be endorsed.

How will I receive my transcript?

Hardcopy transcript will be sent to your home university within two months after the end of exchange.
