APPLICATION FOR HOUSING

APPLICATION PROCESS



FROM MARCH 15 TO MAY 30



FROM SEPTEMBER 15 TO OCTOBER 18

The host faculty will send the procedure directly to the nominated student. **Remember to carry valid identification.**

The required documents are:

- All academic transcript of records
- Curriculum vitae
- Any language test or a certificate of language. **Please check that the language level required by the host faculty is respected either in French and/or English.**
- Student's motivations
- Learning Agreement UGA (or ERASMUS+ provided by the home university) completed in accordance with the rules defined by the host faculty.

The home university determines the number of credits that can be taken, up to a maximum of **30 credits** per semester.
