Program Cost	MIX works with three types of students: Exchange Students (tuition waiver), Hoakipa Visiting Students (fee-paying with discount), and Independent Visiting Students (full fee-paying). Students must also budget for mandatory health insurance, special course fees, books and supplies, housing, meals, local transportation, and personal expenses.

Off-campus housing can also be highly competitive, so students are strongly encouraged to begin contacting housing providers as soon as they are admitted into the program.			
Visa and Immigration				
Visa	A student who is not a US citizen or permanent resident (resident alien), will need a F-1 student visa in order to study at UHM as an exchange or visiting student. A certificate of eligibility (I-20) will be issued to participants upon admission into the program.			
Health Insurance	UHM requires international students to have adequate health insurance coverage throughout their programs of study. Students must either enroll in a UH-endorsed student health insurance plan or furnish proof of enrollment in a health insurance plan that provides the required minimum coverage. Employment	Exchange and visiting students are allowed to work on-campus within the dates of their program. Employment may total no more than 20 hours per week during the academic semesters. Please note that participants in an exchange or visiting student program offered through Mānoa International Exchange (MIX) are <u>not</u> permitted to participate in pre-completion or post-completion F-1 Practical Training. This includes Curricular Practical Training (CPT), Optional Practical Training (OPT), and internships. For more details, see here: <u>https://manoa.hawaii.edu/mix/inbound/employment/</u> .			
Arrival				
Registration Holds	It is common for incoming exchange students to have the following registration holds placed on their account after the initial course registration period: (1) Health Clearance (TB, MMR, Varicella, TDap); (2) Health Insurance; (3) Visa Clearance; and (4) ELI (English Language Institute). Students are responsible for clearing these holds on their own by the stated deadlines. The Health Clearance holds are particularly strict and may result in students being unenrolled from their courses if they do not clear the holds (or request an extension) by the deadline. More information will be provided after students are admitted.			
Recommended Arrival Dates	Students are strongly advised to arrive one week before the first day of class. An early arrival allows students to participate in the welcome week activities hosted by MIX and ISS, attend New Student Orientation, and clear registration holds prior to the first day of class. Students are <u>not</u> permitted to arrive after the first day of class without prior approval by MIX staff.			
Welcome Guide	Upon acceptance, students will be provided with a digital Welcome Guide from MIX. This guide will provide students with information to help them successfully prepare for their program.
