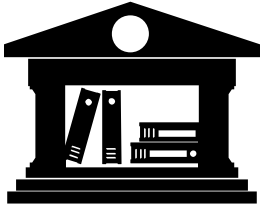

EARLY EXIT

possible option to finish before Christmas

*Most faculties offer courses in block 2 that have an "early exit" option (= finish before Christmas). **This is only possible for students who need to return to their home institution for the second semester in January.** In some cases less than 7.5 ECTS are awarded.*

! Please keep in mind: These are tailor made solutions and it's the student's responsibility to make arrangements with the instructor.

Please note that housing through Reserved Accommodation Programme can only be rented for a full semester period and reimbursement due to an early exit is not possible

EXAMINATIONS PERIOD(S)

Each faculty has its own schedule. Examinations are based on course work, attendance and exams during the semester.

ORIENTATION SESSION(S)

Universitywide orientation and social introduction: a week before classes start/ in the first week of the semester.
Most faculties also have an orientation session.

Course Registration:

Filling in a preliminary course form is part of the application. Most faculties email students on official course enrollment before the start of the semester. Changes after arrival are difficult.

It's not possible to combine courses from UCU, UCR & UU.

Course levels

Level 1 = introductory
Level 2 = intermediate
Level 3 = advanced
Level 4 = Master's

Courses on Bachelor's and/or Master's level available for incoming exchange students?

Both are possible.

Bachelor's: students need at least an equivalent of 60 ECTS (on year of fulltime study).

Master's: depending on student's academic level, prerequisites (differs per faculty) and departmental approval.

Transcripts

Each faculty has its own administration of credits and grades. We will forward them to the partner university and student when it becomes available.

Language requirements

English and/or Dutch

Language Test Certificate

Excellent knowledge of either ENGLISH or DUTCH is required. A language proficiency report (attached) is **compulsory** if Dutch or English is not your native language.

In case you have other proof of proficiency (such as a language test certificate, see below) please upload this instead of the language proficiency report form.

Other approved proof of proficiency

BACHELOR's

- IELTS: minimum score 6.5 (minimum writing score: 5.5)
- TOEFL: minimum 83
- Cambridge: CAE minimum C; CPE minimum C
- CEFR: minimum level B2

MASTER's

- IELTS: minimum score 6.5 (minimum writing score 6.0)
- TOEFL: minimum 93
- Cambridge: CAE minimum B, CPE minimum C
- CEFR: minimum level C1

UCU Language Requirements

Student at fully English taught university, or:

- IELTS: minimum average of 7.0 (for all components, with no partial score lower than 6.5)
- TOEFL and TOEFL IBT home edition: internet based 100
- Cambridge C1 Advanced/C2 Proficiency: 185 (both with no partial score below 176)

NOTE! Some departments/faculties have their own selection procedure. Students wishing to take courses here will be submitted according their criteria.

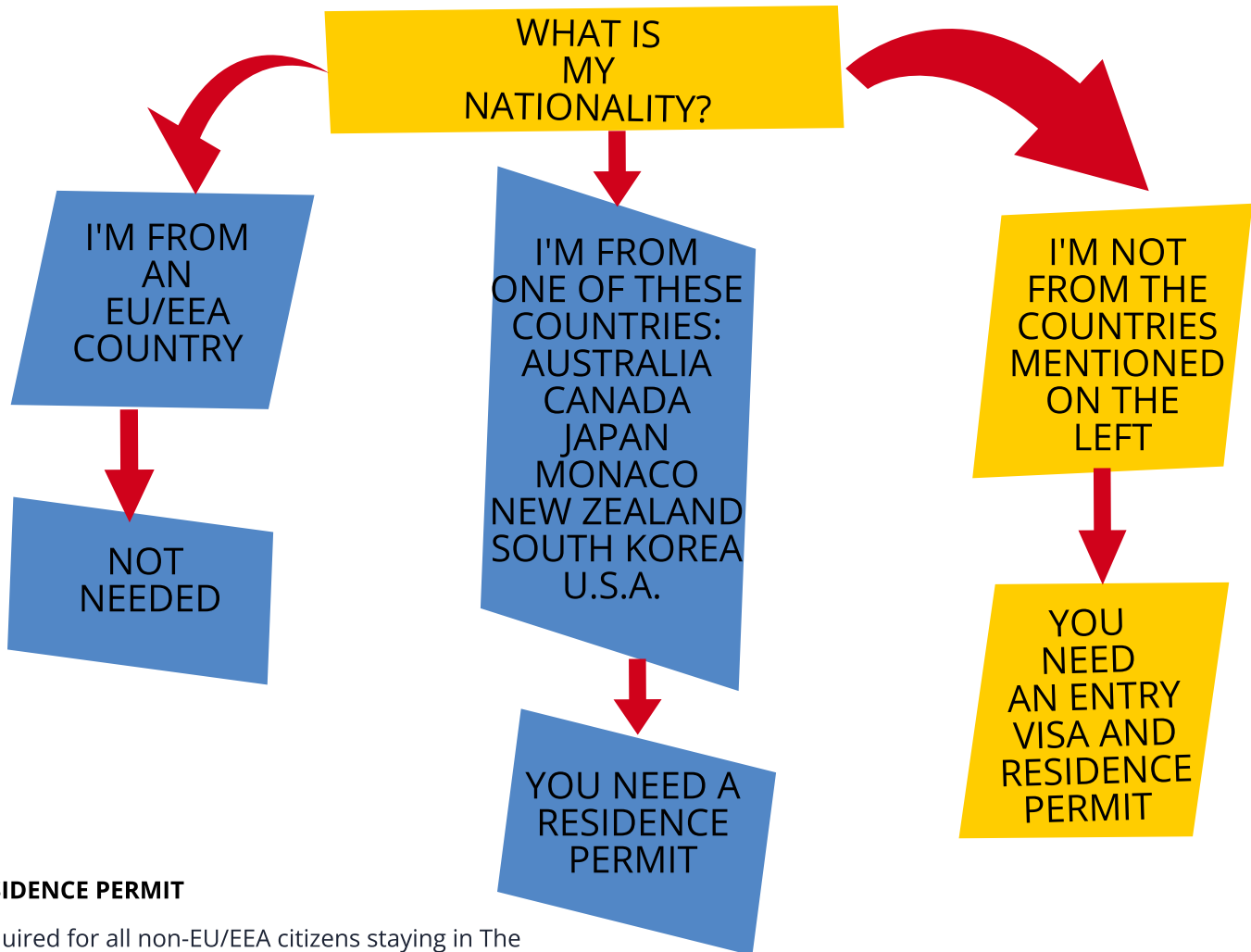

VISA REQUIREMENTS



RESIDENCE PERMIT

Required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months; Exempted from applying for an Entry Visa (MVV) are students with a nationality from:

- UK
- Australia, New Zealand
- Canada, USA
- Japan, South Korea
- Monaco, Vatican City State
- United Kingdom (new)

A residence permit is required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months. After official acceptance students will be informed about necessary documents.

ENTRY VISA & RESIDENCE PERMIT

For students from other countries mentioned on the left, we will apply for an entry visa. The entry visa and residence permit will combined in the procedure. After official acceptance students will be informed about necessary documents.

HOUSING & FINANCES



Universities in the Netherlands do not own student housing. For new international Erasmus+ / Exchange students who meet the requirements, Utrecht University does offer a Reserved Accommodation Programme. This housing is reserved for new international UU students via organisations like SSH Short Stay. The housing offered through this programme is furnished and available for fixed rental periods only.

Be aware that finding housing via this programme is not guaranteed. The offers are limited and on first come, first served basis. You can find more information on this page:

When to start searching for housing?

It is a good idea to anticipate the time and effort it may take you to find a room, and start your search for housing several months in advance. For students who are eligible for the Reserved Accommodation Programme, the registration and booking dates are posted on the website. If you are eligible, it is possible to apply for this housing prior to your formal admission.

COST OF LIVING

(including housing, food and transportation)

HEALTH INSURANCE

Health insurance comparable to "ICS-Complete" from AON is allowed.

STUDENT JOBS

Jobs for students are available and allowed. Non-EU/EEA students require a work permit and are restricted to a maximum amount of 10 hours working/a week OR full-time in the summer (June - August).
